How area teens rank among their peers in dating violence . . . and how to minimize the risk

School are close to the national average when it comes to statistics pinpointing teen dating violence.

According to a Bureau of Justice Special Report, 40 percent of U.S. high school students say they know someone their age who has already experienced some type of violence during a dating relationship.

Typically, in dating violence, one partner tries to maintain power and control over the other through some type of abuse

Although most victims are young women, dating violence can be found in all racial, social and economic groups, as well as among both sexes and age categories.

Dating violence can include verbal and physical violence and forced sex. In an informal random survey taken at Corona, 37 per cent of the respondents knew someone who had experienced some type of teen dating violence.


One of the main problems with teen violence is that teenagers frequently do not realize they are in an impending volatile situation until it is too late.

Teenagers can often choose better relationships if they are able to identify the early warning signs of an abusive relationship. So how do you recognize behavior in a date that may eventually lead to aggressive or abusive actions?

According to the experts, there are several signs that can help teens identify the potential for date violence in others.



Engineering career downturn prompting major recruiting effort by Tempe

ewer students are choosing the engineering field as a career path, and Tempe wants to see that changed.

City public-works officials hope to encourage middle- and high-school students, as well as incoming college freshmen, to consider careers in engineering.

So they've launched a series of educational workshops that will showcase engineering and related careers to about 200 students, including minorities and females.

The summer program will give participants a chance to check out the types of heavy equipment the city uses, attend tours with engineers and participate in hands-on activities. Students will see equipment such as bucket trucks, front loaders and refuse trucks.

Nationally, says **Jennifer Adams**, Tempe's Deputy Public Works manager, engineering jobs are less sought after, with women and minorities especially underrepresented.

The city's Public Works Department has a recruitment outreach committee that regularly participates in events for adults and children, to educate the community about what the department does for the city and explain the array of prospective career opportunities.

The committee's mission is to provide networking and employment opportunities that increase the diversity of the Public Works Department.

"Our goal is to educate the community and the students about the many diverse opportunities Public Works has to offer," Adams said.

A final shummer educational event will be held Tuesday, July 15, for 60 middle school students. Similar programs for high school students and incoming college freshmen already have been held.

General admission seating, with \$7 admission for all performances.



Chronicling how video games bleeped, blooped into our lives

The sound of bleeps and bloops filled the air as kids and adults mashed buttons and toggled joysticks at the opening of the ZAP! Vintage Video Games Exhibit. The free event, ongoing through mid-September at McCullough-Price House in west Chandler, chronicles the evolution of videogames from the early 1900s, when pinball machines were all the rage, to the "golden age" of video games in the '70s and '80s when games like Pac Man emerged nto pop culture.

"A lot of times people think of history as stuff that's way in the past," said Jean Reynolds, Chandler public history coordinator. "People don't think about how we have a lot of contemporary history."

Barbara Anselmo, a McCullough-Price House staff member, said considerable interest was generated in the exhibit, even prior to its opening.

"I think it's a good way for children to learn about the development of technology," said Anselmo. "They can see that it's a product of innovation and imagination."

Along with a video game timeline, the exhibit provides older consoles like the Atari and original arcade games, for patrons to play. Families gathered around to shoot pixilated space invaders with cannons and thwart centipedes crawling around mushrooms.

Chandler resident **Dawn Clark** came with her husband and two children to the exhibit

"The kids love video games, and we've told them about the old-style games," said Clark. "They're so used to the [new games]

'WALL-E': A shipload of fun

That if mankind had to leave
Earth and someone forgot
to turn off the last robot?
That's the captivating premise posed
by Disney-Pixar's new, animated sci-fi
love story set 700 years into the future.

WALL-E (voice talent by Ben Burtt) is a cross between a robot and a trash compactor. This lonely soul was abandoned by his human creators centuries earlier, yet he continues to go about his designed task of compacting garbage into stackable cubes and piling them up into mini-skyscrapers.

Trudging through the dusty, trashfilled landscape while performing his pointless routine, dutiful WALL-E also collects artifacts such as cigarette lighters and old spoons along the way, storing them neatly in a truck he calls home. In his spare time, he watches old dance musicals.

What makes WALL-E so endearing to the audience is his curiosity, respect for all living things, including a cockroach he befriends, and his appreciation for sunsets and starlit nights.

Clearly, WALL-E is a Renaissance robot and a romantic. All he needs is an object for his affection, which is soon deposited on the planet's surface by a large spaceship. Enter EVE, an extra-terrestrial vegetation evaluator.

EVE is a sleek, ultra-advanced, powerful probe sent back to Earth by the last colony of humans, who are now living in a space-docked ship. EVE's mission is to search for any sign of

vegetation that would be a signal it is safe for humans to return to Earth.

Scanning the bleak and desolate urban landscape, EVE soon runs into WALL-E, but is unimpressed by the primitive compactor on wheels. Although she tries to ignore him, for lonely WALL-E it's love at first sight, and he pursues EVE with dogged determination.

Using every trick in a suitor's handbook, WALL-E "the Romeo" eventually wins the heart of EVE. The eagerly sought-after affection comes at a price, however. EVE almost destroys WALL-E and his home when she practices dancing! Children in the audience roar with laughter during this *Dancing with the Stars* spoof.

Humor turns to tension mid-way in the film when WALL-E presents EVE with a plant as a gift. The plant is the key to the planet's future, and EVE abruptly ends their romance and races back to the luxury spaceship, Axiom, to report her finding. WALL-E tags along as a stowaway.

Axiom is occupied by the descendants of the original humans who escaped from a uninhabitable Earth 700 years earlier.

As in the film *I Robot*, humans have completely delegated all forms of manual labor to robots, and as such have evolved into morbidly obese slugs that can't even walk. The über-fat humans glide around the ship on antigravity lounge chairs all day, slurping high-fructose corn syrup drinks and

watching futuristic television screens.

Those who've been on a cruise ship will laugh out loud at this scene because they will surely identify with such people.

EVE's delivery of the green plant to the spaceship's captain is thwarted by a 2001 A Space Odyssey HAL-like super computer, complete with large, blinking red eye. The computer runs the ship and is fearful of becoming obsolete should Earth become inhabitable, and thus feels it must destroy the plant.

Eventually, WALL-E and EVE reunite on the ship and recruit a heroic team of malfunctioning misfit robots from the spaceships psych ward, which is hilarious and reminiscent of *One Flew Over the Cuckoo's Nest*.

What is remarkable with the film *WALL-E* is that there is a shipload of humor throughout the movie – and it was all done without a stable of superstar celebrity voice talents.

The film's only minor blemish of the is the mismatched love interest.

Although the electricity between WALL-E and EVE is unmistakable, it is a highly improbable romantic paring. Imagine the union of WALL-E, a dirty, primitive, unsophisticated garbage collector and EVE, a clean, polished, technologically superior robotic probe.

Watching these two hold hands takes quite a leap of faith.

Aside from that, however, *WALL-E* has everything else necessary to entertain moviegoers of all ages, including an out-of-this-world story, appealing music (I particularly liked Louis Armstrong's rendition of *La Vie En Rose*), humor, imagination and impressive CGI animation.



For example, does the person you are dating get extremely jealous and angry when you go out with or talk to others? More than 75 percent of Corona respondents said they were either dating or had dated someone who expressed this type of behavior.

"One of my friends could not go out with anyone unless she constantly told him where she was and what she was doing," said one Corona teen.

Another behavior that should make you think twice about dating a person has to do with privacy. When asked if they were dating or had dated someone who violated their privacy by reading their notes to or from someone and/or went through their backpacks, purses or other things without permission, 80 percent of the Corona respondents said they had.

"He looked through my cell phone without my permission," one respondent said. "He was trying to read my text messages when I caught him."

Other warning signs include constantly checking up on you, unpredictable mood swings and trying to make you choose between him/her and your friends and/or family.

Think twice about dating someone who has ever held you down, pushed, hit, kicked or thrown something at you.

The fact that only 10 percent of Corona respondents answered yes to this physical abuse warning sign is not surprising.

Teenagers often do not admit to violence in a relationship because they are inexperienced with dating relationships, are pressured by peers to act violently or are seeking independence from their parents.

"One time we broke up and she jumped me after school," said one Corona teenager about his current girlfriend. "I was frightened by her sudden change in behavior."

"I had to be constantly on the lookout for this one girl because she kept throwing things at me after we broke up," said another Corona student. "I seemed to run into her everywhere I went."

Threatening violence or doing something to your car, house or property after a breakup is another sign. Surprisingly, 30 percent of the Corona respondents said this had happened to them in a current or past relationship.

"I never knew what I was going to find when I went out to get in my car," wrote one Corona teen. "Several times my car was egged or had creepy messages written on the windows. I had to start driving my mom's car to school to keep her away."

Be wary of someone who says he or she can't live without you, and imposes restrictions on the way you dress or your appearance.

Stay clear of someone who humiliates you by putting you down in private or in front of others, blames others for his/her problems or feelings, threatens suicide if you leave him/her or you find yourself unable to disagree with them.

Dating someone who harasses you after you break up by following you, showing up uninvited, spreading rumors

about you and/or makes prank phone calls is a warning sign that 47 percent of the Corona respondents identified in their present or past relationships.

Once a teenager gets involved in an abusive relationship, it is often hard for them to get out. Sometimes they fear for their personal safety or they don't want anyone to know.

It may be, once again, that they don't recognize they are in a potentially abusive situation

Parents and other adults can help by looking for these clues that may indicate if a teenager is experiencing dating violence:

Physical signs of injury; truancy; dropping out of school; failing grades; indecision; changes in mood or personality; use of drugs or alcohol; emotional outburst; and isolation.

If you or someone you know is in a potentially abusive relationship, there are several ways to get help in ending the relationship.

First, seek help from family, a teacher or other adult that you can trust.



You can also go to a local domestic violence program for help but it may be easier to call someone who specializes in teen dating violence such as the National Teen Dating Abuse Helpline available 24 hours at day at 1-866-331-9474.

Here you can talk one-on-one with a trained peer advocate who can offer support and connect you to resources seven days a week.

You can also chat online with trained experts who can discuss your options from 2 p.m. to midnight at http://www.loveisrespect.org/

If you break up with someone and he or she continues to harass or follow you, take legal action such as a restraining order or assault charges to protect yourself and your family.

In addition, you should think ahead about ways to protect yourself if you are in a dangerous or potentially dangerous relationship.

Design your own safety plan around these key strategies:

- · What people at school can you tell in order to be safe such as teachers, principals, counselors and security?
- · Consider changing your school locker and your route to and from school.
- · Find someone as a buddy for going to school, classes, and after school activities.
 - Think about what friends you can

tell to help you remain safe.

• If you are stranded somewhere, who could you call?

- Keep a journal describing the abuse.
- · Think about where you could go quickly to get away from an abusive person.

The best way to date safely and avoid teen violence is to consider utilizing a few safety strategies before dating a new

- · First, consider double dating on the first few dates.
- Make sure you know the exact plans for the evening and make sure a parent or friend also knows the plans too before you
- · Realize that alcohol and drugs reduce your ability to react.
- Before leaving a party with someone you do not know well, be sure to tell another person all the details.
- Be firm and straightforward in your relationships and trust your instincts.
- If you feel uncomfortable in a situation, remain calm and come up with a plan to remove yourself from the scene

Keep in mind that statistics show that approximately 40 percent of daterape victims are young women from 14 to 17 years of age and that more than half of the young women raped knew their rapist either as a boyfriend, friend or causal acquaintance.

Six out of 10 rapes of young women occur in their own home or a friend or relative's home and not in some dark alley or the back seat of a car.

Last but not least, approximately

seven percent of all murder victims in 2002 were young women who were killed by their boyfriends.

Studies also show that female abuse against their male dates is on the rise.

If you realize after reading this article that you are in an abusive relationship, take steps to help yourself get out by telling your parents or another trusted adult.

Proposed changes to sex-ed materials generating little public feedback Catholic Charities would replace teachers as purveyors of course content

THE THE PROPERTY OF THE PROPER

I ow school districts develop sex-education curriculum that's in balance with parents' widely varying personal, religious and philosophical beliefs historically represents one of education's biggest challenges.

In fact, it was the basis of a small hornet's nest of controversy several years ago in the Kyrene district, where some middle-school parents vehemently opposed various elements of the program, namely

the inclusion of certain anatomical terminology they considered inappropriate.

When the dust settled and a course of study was adopted, staff members agreed that, the next time the issue came up for discussion, they'd increase the number of people involved in the process and encourage more input than had been received during earlier rounds of study.

So, by the time the district started determining which books and audio-visual materials might be used to teach the approved course, the committee had grown to 35 staff and community members from the previous handful.

Although full consensus was not achieved, the committee's report met with approval and, according to curriculum and assessment administrator **Carrie Furedy**, a public review of the recommended resources yielded positive results.

"A lot of people turned out to look at the materials," said Furedy. "Overall, the response was

positive, with people saying, 'Well, it wasn't as bad as I thought it would be."

The teaching meterials that subsequently.

The teaching materials that subsequently appeared in classrooms during the 2006-07 school year were considered "quality and informational," said Furedy, adding however that they were not necessarily the same resources that might be utilized in future years.

"We used a PowerPoint presentation with nice colors, but the information was presented in a straightforward, factual way, which is not always engaging for students," Furedy said.

Now, with the Kyrene Governing Board scheduled to consider possible changes in how the classes will taught next year, the study committee has once again taken on a challenge.

"For the parents who have served on this committee, they have been pretty much living with me," said Furedy, describing the stepped-up intensity to make an Aug. 22 deadline imposed by the governing board.

Meeting twice monthly for two to three hours each time, the group has reviewed existing videos and books, considering whether to keep the lessons intact or supplement them with district-developed activities and discussion, which Furedy says were lacking in the earlier materials.

Although the approaches under consideration are not designed to change the previously approved curriculum, they might modify the way in which the subject is taught, Furedy noted.


That, it turns out, could be a relief to district teachers.

"It's really hard for teachers in our middle schools to teach (sex education)," said Furedy. "They don't always feel they're trained, especially in this."

District administrators yielded to the teachers' reservations, going so far as to replace the teachers' own live commentary with a pre-recorded voice-over







narrative.

With such issues in mind, coupled with what Furedy insists is the committee's determination to come up with the best possible recommendation, the group decided to investigate several successful approaches, including one developed by Catholic Charities as part of its abstinence-information program and used in schools nationwide.

To see the program in action, Furedy and committee members spent a week at Gilbert Junior High School, an experience she called "a turning point" in their decision process.

"We went there because we wanted to make sure that the delivery (of the content) was not fear based, that there was no religious piece to this instruction," she said, noting that being Catholic is not a prerequisite for selection as an instructor.

Its major concerns resolved, the committee decided to recommend utilizing the Catholic Charities staff and teaching materials, woven into Kyrene's existing curriculum.

The only step left was to make the proposed study materials available for public review and offer an opportunity for one last round of community input.

To the committee's surprise, however, only a small amount of public feedback was received, and the review period was extended to 100 days from 60.

With the clock ticking toward the board's August meeting, Furedy still is hoping for the community's involvement.

"Our committee desperately wants to hear what the community has to say," said Furedy. "This is not a rubber-stamp situation; we really want feedback."

Although she defends the committee's makeup as "very representative of the community, from

extremely conservative to extremely liberal, and everywhere in-between," she says the group knows "it isn't perfect."

While it has spent countless hours trying to develop materials that deserve broad public support, the committee knows it could have missed something in the process.

"If people feel this doesn't fit with our community, we want them to let us know," said Furedy. "We're absolutely willing to consider change."

What's right for some parents may be wrong for others, she knows.

"My position might be different if you're talking about reading," Furedy says. "But you're talking about teaching sex; every person has a different perspective of what's right for them.

"Our challenge is to develop what is best for every single child."

Whether or not parents agree with the committee's recommended study materials, they still have options, Furedy notes, including the requirement that every child participating in sexeducation programs must have a parental opt-in form on file.

The governing board will make its decision on the coming school year's study materials at its meeting Tuesday, Aug. 26.

The public has until 5 p.m. Monday, Aug. 22, to review the materials and offer comments.

Even though the board's vote should bring an end to the current evaluation process, the committee's work won't be done. Studies will get under way shortly on curriculum materials for fourth, fifth and seventh graders; content being used by sixth graders is considered adequate and is not currently due for review.

Proposed study materials are available for examination at Kyrene district offices, 8700 S. Kyrene Road, Tempe, from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Monday through Thursday until July 18 (closed July 14), and 8-4:30 July 21 through Aug. 22.

Governing board addresses Corona air-quality issue

The Tempe Union High School District Governing Board and District administration have been immersed in resolving Corona del Sol High School's air quality issues for quite some time. We write now to provide accurate information to those of you with many reasonable questions.

Corona del Sol High School was built in 1975 as an energy-efficient school, with the requirement to be as airtight as possible. Classrooms designed for 20 students now accommodate 30-35 students, and ninety percent of the 1978 mechanical equipment is still operational.

The Arizona School Facilities Board, created in 1999, was charged with evaluating all existing school buildings, identifying deficiencies and making necessary corrections to meet minimum State standards. One indicator of indoor air quality is based on carbon dioxide levels. During initial inspection in 2001, Corona met minimum facilities-board standards.

The District questioned both the methodology and test results and requested reconsideration. This was denied.

From 2002 to present, occupants have periodically complained of stagnant air or a musty smell. Professional industrial hygienists investigated each time a complaint was made and their reports indicated there was inadequate ventilation causing increased relative humidity and accumulated indoor pollutants. A small amount of mold remediation work was completed at Corona del Sol in 2006 as a result of air quality testing.

In September 2006, Health Effects Group was hired to conduct a comprehensive indoor air quality assessment. The report indicated that during a normal school day CO2 build-up in occupied classrooms and common areas exceeded acceptable specified levels according to standards set by the American Society of Heating, Refrigeration & Air Conditioning Engineers and the School Facilities Board.

HEG reported that, "There is no evidence of any long-term negative effects for students and staff at Corona del Sol. The only persons who may have concern would be those with already-existing severe respiratory problems."

In order to address identified concerns, the District formally requested emergency funding from the state facilities board in May 2007 to correct the HVAC deficiency. The facilities board denied two additional requests. The District made a final appeal in February 2008 and was again denied.

The District has begun a four-phase construction project to resolve identified issues at Corona del Sol. The estimated cost of the project is over \$14 million. Phase I consists of replacing an existing chiller with a larger capacity chiller, larger pumps, and the upgrade of electrical services. These monies were available within the District budget and work was completed in May 2008.

Phase II consists of installing a new supply loop for chilled water to classrooms and installing new exhaust fans to help reduce CO2 levels. These monies are available within the District budget and work will be completed when school begins in August.

Phase III consists of electrical upgrades and requires additional anding.

Phase IV construction consists of air conditioning unit installment in each classroom and requires additional funding.

Tempe Union High School District Governing Board members and administration deeply appreciate the efforts of our Governor and elected officials in passing financial legislation to order to provide assistance with the Corona project. We have worked cooperatively with them for many months and will continue to do so as the District has exhausted all funding for the needed work at Corona and has reallocated all existing building renewal funds from other (school) sites. Now it will be the voters' turn to approve a bond that will provide the necessary funding to complete the project in the November 2008 general election.




